Arizona WIC Program Declared Milk

Question: Why do we have to sell the store's declared store/house brand?

Answer: The amount of money provided to WIC has been decreased. Buying the store or

house brand will save money and allow WIC to continue to serve as many eligible

clients as possible.

Question: How does the WIC Customer know what the store/house brand for milk is?

Answer: All WIC Vendors are required to use the Arizona WIC Program's Approved

Signage for all authorized store/house brand of milk.

Ouestion: What should I do if our store runs out of our declared store or house brand of

milk (whole, reduced fat (2%), low fat (1%), or skim/fat free) that is specified

on the WIC customer's food instrument?

Answer: You will sell the WIC customer any brand of milk that is available at the time of

purchase for the <u>same price</u> as your declared store or house brand. The milk (whole, reduced fat (2%), low fat (1%), or skim/fat free) purchased must be as

specified on their food instrument.

Example: Your store has run out of your store or house brand of milk. Your store has another

brand of milk available that cost more. You would sell the WIC customer the brand of milk that is available as specified on their food instrument. You must

charge the same price as your declared store or house brand of milk.

Question: What is a store brand?

Answer: A store brand is a product that is manufactured and packaged fro a particular store

or retail chain.

Question: What is a house brand?

Answer: A house brand is a proprietary brand of merchandise sold by one retailer, such as:

IGA, Springfield, Shurfine, Western Family, Hy-Top, Market Pantry, etc. It can also be a name brand item a store has declared to be their "house brand" for WIC

purposes if the store does not have its own house brand.
